Dr. Hannon has practiced small and exotic animal medicine in the greater Memphis, TN area since June 1993 and has served as the primary veterinarian for Lichterman Nature Center from June 1993 until its Wildlife Resource Center was closed in September 1998. In Tennessee there are three others, but all of them are at the University of Tennessee College of Veterinary Medicine in Knoxville. There are no avian diplomates in West Tennessee, Arkansas, or Mississippi! Dr. Hannon is now qualified to work at a zoo, veterinary school, or referral practice.
